



The goal of the Master Plan is to identify the short- and long-term goals and objectives as well as associated projects that will renew and revitalize the historic estate and better serve the community. Projects will either involve additions of new elements that will enhance and support the Nature Center's programs and activities.



Barnyard 2009 - Already completed: This larger barnyard gives the Center an opportunity to expand our collection of domestic animals, which will both enhance our sustainability curriculum and provide the general public with a more varied viewing experience.



Nature's Discovery Zone for Children 2009 - This project will be a unique nature-themed playground designed to engage children in outdoor exploration and discovery. This area will serve children ages 2 – 12 and will provide a variety of play elements intended to mimic the natural environment. Possible elements include a spider web to climb, an eagle nest to sit in, animal tracks to identify, and a fossil dig area to explore.



Sustainable Schoolhouse 2010 - This project seeks to address one of our most pressing needs — an additional infrastructure area to conduct our education programming. The structure will include sustainable building techniques, materials and resource consumption. The Schoolhouse will also function as a multi-purpose facility to serve special interest groups, public forums and GNC fundraising events.



Westchester Wetlands Waterfowl Aviary 2011 - The Aviary will depict a wetlands habitat in a natural setting and will feature native species of waterfowl. Interpretive signage will inform visitors about wetlands conservation and the preservation of regional biodiversity, as well as explain the important role that wetlands conservation plays in mitigating watershed management problems in Westchester.

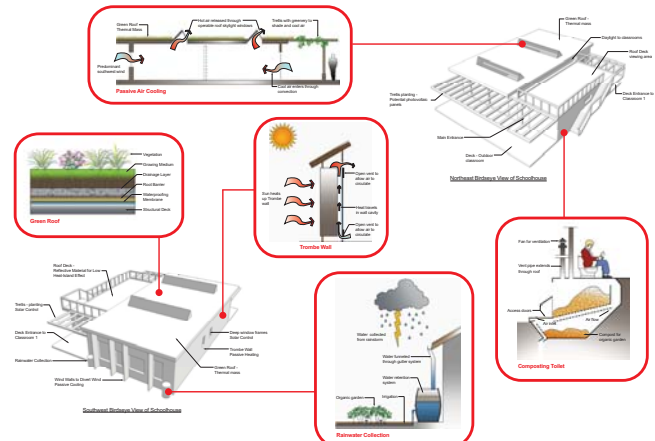
